

**Equalization Board** - Appointees to this 3-member board are recommended by the Board of Supervisors and appointed by the Circuit Court. All members must be residents of Greene County and at least one (1) member shall be commercial or residential real estate appraisers or other real estate professionals, builders, developers or legal or financial professionals. The Board shall hear complaints that real property is assessed at more than fair market value; shall hear and give consideration o such complaints; shall adjust and equalize such assessments and shall consider all applications by property owners or lessees for relief following the general reassessment of real estate. The Board sits an average of two to four days per session. Training is required.

**Jefferson Area Board for Aging - Advisory Council** – Jefferson Area Board for Aging (JABA) was established in 1975 and serves the needs of the aging community in the counties of Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa and Nelson. With a mission to promote, establish and preserve sustainable communities for healthy aging that benefit individuals and families of all ages, JABA faces many challenges to support a growing population of elders. Council members act to provide input on the development and administration of JABA’s Area Plan; to participate in public hearings; to represent the interests of older persons; and to review and comment on all community policies, programs, and actions affecting the senior citizens and elder caregivers of Planning District Ten. The Advisory Council meets on the first Thursday of the month in January, March, May, July, September, November with additional meetings as necessary. **Region Ten Community Services Board** provides for the mental health needs of residents in Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, and Nelson Counties, and the City of Charlottesville. Members of the Board of Directors are appointed by their respective Boards of Supervisors or City Council to oversee the establishment and operation of community mental health, intellectual disabilities, and substance use disorder programs. Appointed terms are for three years, with members serving no more than three successive terms. Region Ten is a forward-thinking and compassionate organization. Our goal is to help consumers integrate into their own communities and strengthen families. Our challenges demand the best we can give. The possibilities are limitless.

**Emergency Services Advisory Board (ESAB)** – The ESAB consists of eleven (11) members, ten (10) key public safety stakeholders and one (1) citizen representative. The mission of the ESAB is to serve as the primary resource and advocate for all Greene County Emergency Services Organizations in their efforts to mitigate or prevent harm to life, property, and the environment. The ESAB is established to advise the Greene County Board of Supervisors on public safety matters and issues. The scope of the ESAB will deal with fire protection, law enforcement, emergency medical and rescue matters, disaster planning and coordination, and other matters involving the protection of persons and property in Greene County. ESAB members are expected to meet monthly, make decisions by vote, and regularly attend meetings. Regular meetings of the ESAB shall be held on the third Tuesday of each month at 6:00 pm.

**Jefferson Area Community Criminal Justice Board** – The board’s purpose is to oversee the operation of the Community Diversion Incentive Program, funded by the state to divert non-violent felons to community service/treatment and away from prison for the counties of Albemarle, Fluvanna, Goochland, Greene, Louisa, Madison, Orange, and Nelson and the City of Charlottesville. Meetings are held quarterly on the second Wednesday from 4-5:30 p.m. at the Water Street Center.

**The Greene County Children's Services Act, CSA, Community Policy and Management Team**, CPMT, is seeking a volunteer community parent representative to become a part of the team. CPMT meetings are on the second Wednesday of each month at 9:00 am and/or the fourth Tuesday of each month at 9:30 a.m. Goal: Provide a parent perspective when addressing and assessing policy and service decisions for troubled and at-risk youth and families. Duties:

- Attend scheduled CPMT meetings.
- Take an active role in policy decisions, service selection and approval of services and funding for at-risk youth and families.

Preference given to a parent familiar with the CSA process or former recipient of CSA services. Must be a resident of Greene County, have strong communications skills, a desire to learn, confident and willing to speak out at meetings consisting of diverse perspectives; must be mature, compassionate, dependable, empathetic and a team player; must be capable of remaining objective in emotionally charged situations; must respect the beliefs and traditions of individuals coming from a wide variety of cultural, religious and ethnic backgrounds; must be willing and able to maintain strict confidentiality requirements.
