RE: PUBLIC HEARING – ELBERT AND NETTIE COLLIER – REMOVE PROFFERS

Mr. Bart Svoboda, Zoning Administrator, reviewed the request from Elbert and Nettie Collier to remove proffers approved on May 29, 2001 (RZ#01-135) regarding the limiting of uses on a 2.89 acre tract rezoned B-2, Business, located in Stanardsville on Spotswood Trail and identified on County Tax Maps as 38-A-65. (RZ#13-003)

The applicants have filed a rezoning application to remove proffers that were approved on May 29, 2001 regarding the limiting of uses on this tract. The proffers approved limited the use to a furniture store only. The property was rezoned from R-1 to B-2 with proffers.

The Planning Commission recommended approval of the proffer amendment. If approved, all proffers that were approved May 29, 2001 will be null and void.

Opened floor for public comment. Mr. Eric Lamb questioned the designation of this property in the Comprehensive Plan. Staff report indicates mixed use village center. He thinks suburban residential. Public hearing was closed.

Mrs. Barbara Shifflett, Mr. & Mrs. Collier's daughter, said the property is currently zoned B-2. She noted other businesses/offices in the area.

Mr. Svoboda reviewed the request from South River Methodist Church for a Special Use Permit for an existing non-conforming church on approximately 1.79 acre tract zoned A-1, Agriculture, located on South River Road and identified on County Tax Maps as 19-(A)-19. (SUP#13-005)

Approval of this request would bring the church use into conformance with the Greene County Zoning Ordinance and also allow for future expansions. Pursuant to Article 15, non-conforming uses may not expand.

The Planning Commission recommended approval of the Special Use Permit.

RE: VDOT QUATERLY MEETING

Mr. Joel Denunzio, Resident Administrator, introduced Mr. John Lynch, Culpeper District Administrator, and Mr. Andrew Scott, Core Development Program.

Mr. Denunzio reported the following:

- Route 604 bridge project – recently completed
- Received traffic engineering report on proposed truck restriction on Route 33 Business thru Town – traffic division is not recommending approval of truck restriction – findings were presented to CTB member – District Administrator in Culpeper also has to receive comments – ultimately still goes to CTB
- Sims Road/Rose Brook Road reversed – Sims Road is priority
- Requested speed study at Greenecroft – extend 45 mph – make improvements to intersection –
- Maintenance activity – tracking activity more accurately – guys stay real busy and do great job

Mr. Lamb asked who requested the line painting on Route 609. Mr. Lynch said he did not know but could find out.

Mr. Deane thanked VDOT for the cleanup on Route 33.

Mr. Peyton thanked VDOT for extension of turn lane on Route 29 and the Mutton Hollow bridge project

Mr. Frydl asked about signs for private schools. Mr. Denunzio said VDOT permits the signs but the schools fund and maintain the flashing lights.

Opened floor for public comment.

Mr. Glen Shifflett – Ice House Road – lived in area 33 years – been fighting to get road paved – rain causes problems with mud – please help get road fixed

Julius Morris – Trustee of Sunnyside Land Trust – VDOT official indicated if right-of-way was available to tie into Route 33 it would help move project forward - problem with donation of right-of-way previously – right-of-way is available now – Barrington Place has been paved in compliance with VDOT requirements

Mr. Deane said he had received a petition regarding Route 677 which he shared with the Board.

Mr. Denunzio said the new road at Barrington Place has not been accepted into the system yet. Having the road connect straight thru to Route 33 has been discussed. The plan would be to shoot straight thru to Route 33 and cul-de-sac both ends of Ice House Road. The project would have to go through the process for inclusion in the Six Year Plan.

RE: RESOLUTION – PHASE II OF STANARDSVILLE DOWNTOWN STREETSCAPE REVITALIZATION PROJECT

Mr. Gary Lowe, Mayor of the Town of Stanardsville, spoke briefly on the project. Hopefully, Phase I will be completed by the first Saturday in December for the Parade of Lights.

Application for Phase II needs to be submitted by November 1. Phase II would continue work with sidewalks from Celt Road to Lawson's Garage. The Town is asking for support for this project by the County.

Mr. Cox asked about a snow removal policy for the Town. Specifically, who will be responsible for removing snow from bump outs. Mr. Lowe said the Town does not have a snow removal policy. He said the bump outs were approved by VDOT. Mr. Deane said he has heard complaints from school bus drivers and sees problems in the future.

He continues to have problems with the food bank being located in the building and subsequent traffic. Visitors to the food bank are trespassing on private property. He asked who would be liable if someone is hurt on that property. This use is being allowed but has not been approved.

Mrs. Jeanette Lamb said she homeschools her children and is enraged by the interruptions caused by trespassing on the playground. The property is posted but she still has to tell children that it is private property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Greene, Virginia that the amount of o one hundred seventy-one thousand two hundred fifty-three dollars and ninety-two cents (\$171,253.92) to be received from the above programs be accepted and appropriated to the appropriate line items in the 2013-14 Operating Budget of the County of Greene, Virginia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Administrator of the County of Greene, Virginia is authorized to make the appropriate accounting adjustments in the budget and to do all things necessary to give this resolution effect.
